


Urine Collection for Children (Using U-Bag®)

Patient Information Sheet

If you require further collection bags please email **LSC@tdlpathology.com** or call **020 7307 7373** who will be able to assist you. Please return the sample with the Request Form. Read through all of the instructions below before taking your sample.

To obtain the best results when using urine collection bags, the following procedure should be adopted:

- 1 Wash the skin around the genitalia with an antiseptic lotion and dry thoroughly to ensure that the skin is completely free of powders and ointment thus giving good adhesion between plaster and skin.
- 2 The CHIRON plaster is coated with a specially formulated hypo-allergenic adhesive and is shaped to prevent chafing and wrinkling.
- 3 Lie the child flat on the bed or cot and hold the child firmly with the thighs stretched laterally to make the groove as shallow as possible.
- 4 After removing the protective covering from the adhesive, apply the lower end of the plaster, first across the perineum then work upwards ensuring the genitalia protrude into the bag the plaster should not extend over the anus.
- **5** Once applied, examine the bag every 15 minutes and remove it before it becomes overfull; the flow-back restrictor helps to avoid discomfort.
- **6** Having collected sufficient urine, remove the bag from the child.
- 7 Pull off the blue plastic tag and pour the urine into a sterile sample container.
- **8** Write the Patients' name, Date of birth and Date and time of collection on the container.
- **9** Send to our Patient Reception (see the contact details on the reverse of this information sheet) with the request form; in the postal pack provided if the sample is taken at home.
